## Remembrance

November is traditionally the month of Remembrance. Each year acts of Remembrance are held, particularly in churches, to commemorate the fallen in two World Wars and in intervening and subsequent conflicts. Remembrance in 2016 has a special significance because of the Battle of the Somme which took place 100 years ago in the Great War of 1914-1918, beginning on the 1st of July and ending on the 18th of November in 1916. The 'Big Push' as it came to be called, was one of the costliest in terms of casualties on both sides, and for the British Army the costliest ever suffered in one battle. Acts of Remembrance will take place in a number of City churches and these are listed in the Special Services section of this publication. Of particular regard will be the ceremonies held in the church court at **Temple Church** on Friday 11th November, Armistice Day, and Sunday 13th November, Remembrance Sunday when the Last Post and Reveille will be sounded and the Silence will take place. The year 1916 is significant also for the Battle of Jutland which took place from the 29th of May to the 1st of June and which was the only major conflict at sea between large fleets of opposing warships in the Great War. An Act of Remembrance will take place in the churchyard of **St Botolph Bishopsgate**. The memorial there is believed to be the first memorial of the Great War to be set up in London, being erected in 1916 after the Battle of Jutland.

In the context of armed conflict, and the often difficult decisions that have to be made, the Thursday Conversation on 3rd November at **St Mary at Hill** at 6.30pm, will be of particular significance. Colonel Bob Stewart DSO, Member of Parliament for Beckenham will be speaking on the subject 'Ethical Decision-Making under Fire' and answering questions. Colonel Stewart was Former Commanding Officer of Army forces in Northern Ireland and in 1992 the first United Nations Commander of British Forces in Bosnia.

Remembrance of a different kind will feature in the Annual Service taking place at **St Sepulchre without Newgate** on Tuesday 1st November at 6.30pm in the Musicians' Chapel at that church. This will take the form of a Choral Eucharist in memory of all departed musicians. It takes place under the auspices of the Friends of the Musicians' Chapel and all will be welcome to attend the Service.

On the subject of music it will be seen that, as usual, there are many musical events taking place in the City churches and all are most promising. Of particular interest will be the first of a new series of monthly recitals to be held on the last Friday of the month at **St Stephen Walbrook** under the propitious title of 'St Stephen's Serenade with the Lord Mayor'. At 5.30pm on Friday 25th November the first of these recitals will take place. The soloist will be Michael Butten who will be performing on the classical guitar and programme details can be found in the listing at the appropriate date. The title of this new series is intriguing in that it features the Lord Mayor and it is the newly elected holder of that distinguished office, Alderman Dr Andrew Parmley, who is a prime mover behind the series. Among his many achievements he is an accomplished musician, being the organist at the City church of **St James Garlickhythe**, Wren's 'lantern', and a specialist in 17th century French music. Also he was Master Musician in 2011-2012. We wish Alderman Dr Parmley well in his coming year as Lord Mayor of the City of London and we wish the new musical venture at St Stephen Walbrook every success.
