Our mission in City Events is to publicise events taking place in the City of London churches. While the listing of musical events plays a major part in City Events we should not forget the primary function of the City churches and in that respect we provide a comprehensive list of regular services taking place throughout the City. From time to time we list special services and in July there is one particular service which more than justifies its listing. In September 2014 we were all reminded of the 100 years that had elapsed since the outbreak of the World War 1, or the Great War as it is also known, and each year in City Events we list the special services of Remembrance held on or near the 11th of November. Since 2014 we have been reminded of key battles that took place in 'the war to end all wars'. One such battle took place in 1917 and that was the Battle of Passchendaele, or, to give it its other name, the Third Battle of Ypres. For the soldiers who fought at Passchendaele, it was known as the 'Battle of Mud'. For many, together with The Somme in 2016, it epitomises the First World War. It was a major campaign fought by the Allies with the battle raging on the Western Front from July to November 1917 for control of the ridges south and east of Ypres. At **St Andrew Holborn** there will be held on Thursday 13th July a Service of Commemoration of the Battle of Passchendaele. There are more details at the date entry in the Special Services section.

There is a wealth of interesting and excellent music to be heard in the City churches during July and August. As always the items selected for comment here are those with some unusual quality which catches the eye. Dominating the two months are the Summer Music Festival at **St Lawrence Jewry**, Monday 31 July to Friday 25 August and the St Anne's Bach Festival at **St Mary at Hill** during July. Full listings are given in the following pages. In the Summer Music Festival at St Lawrence Jewry the special theme is the work of J S Bach. The opening recital on Monday 31 July by Tessa Uys (piano) features the much-loved Goldberg Variations and this work will also be heard in the final event of the Festival on Friday 25 August, when it will be performed as an arrangement for string trio. All six of Bach's Suites for unaccompanied cello will be performed (Thursday 3rd, 10th and 17th August) and on Monday 21st August there is the opportunity to hear a Bach Chaconne arranged for the rare combination of four violas. On Wednesday 16th August an unusual work by Bach can be heard - his *Coffee Cantata*. Apparently Bach was a coffee enthusiast and he wrote this secular work in 1735 in celebration of the beverage. It is regarded as the closest Bach ever got to writing an opera. The whole Festival is set to provide a feast of excellent music which will undoubtedly be performed to an excellent standard.

At **St Mary at Hill** the Bach Festival there opens on Friday 7th July also with a performance by of the Goldberg Variations but on this occasion the harpsichord will be the solo instrument played by Asako Ogawa. The Bach Festival ends on Friday 28th July with a programme that includes Bach's concerto for three violins. Picking up the theme of concertos, on Wednesday 5th July at **St Sepulchre without Newgate** a piano concerto extravaganza (to quote the publicity for the concert) can be heard. Beethoven's No 3 and the No 2 by Brahms will be performed. The latter concerto will provide the soloist Shu-Wei Tseng with a formidable challenge. It is interesting to note that she is also a solo 'cellist.

At **St Botolph Bishopsgate** commencing Monday 10th July, *Lunchbreak Opera* will be presenting twice daily (except Wednesday 12th July) until Friday 14th July Puccini's opera in one act - 'Suor Angelica'. It takes just 50 minutes to perform, admission is free and it should prove to be an intriguing musical experience.

Of the numerous organ recitals two catch one's eye. At St Michael Cornhill on Monday 24th July James Thomas will "delight with kaleidoscopic Variations", including works by Pachelbel, Alain, J S Bach and ending with a transcription of Variations on a theme of Haydn by Brahms. At **St Bride Fleet Street** on Friday 28th July Matthew Morley will perform a transcription of Mussorgsky's 'Pictures at an Exhibition' which promises to be stimulating, particularly the 10th and final picture. Then to show just how eclectic is the musical spectrum in City Events this month, at **St Dunstan in the West** on Tuesday 18th July the Freshfields Choir will round off their concert with a medley of songs from 'Mama Mia' the ABBA musical.

One hesitates to venture into hyperbole but your editor feels justified in labelling this double edition of City Events a bumper one with an amazing variety of musical performances listed and to be enjoyed. We now take a month off. The next edition will cover September and we hope our readers will have an enjoyable and musically rewarding summer
