## Anniversaries and Musical Journeys

Once again there are many interesting events taking place in the City Churches. In the review that follows, as always it is not our intention to sideline events not described. It is just that the events reviewed have some special content worthy of highlighting. The first event is one having a very specific connection with the Friends of the City Churches. At the Friends' church, **St Mary Abchurch**, on **Monday 5 June at 3.00pm** a service of Choral Evensong will be held. This will be a service to celebrate both the dedication of St Mary Abchurch in 1687 after the mediaeval building was destroyed in the Great Fire of London in 1666 and the re-hallowing of the church on 5 June 1957 following bomb damage in World War II. Some of the hymns and prayers will be those used at a service in 1937 to mark the 250th Anniversary of the original dedication and in the re-hallowing service in 1957. All are welcome to attend this very special occasion.

We turn now to certain musical events. Throughout 2017 the period instrument ensemble, *Musica Poetica* have been performing the complete choral works of Franz Tunder at **St Sepulchre without Newgate** to mark the 350th anniversary of the composer's death in 1667. The third concert of this series will take place on **Thursday 29 June at 1.10pm** and the pieces to be performed are given at the date in the listings which commence overleaf. Arguably not that well known, Franz Tunder (1614 – 1667) was a German composer and organist of the early to middle Baroque era and he is regarded as an important link between the early German Baroque style and the later Baroque style which culminated in the music of Johann Sebastian Bach (1685 – 1750). In addition Tunder was formative in the development of the chorale cantata. In the concert referred to above two works will be performed, one by Tunder and the other by Bruhns. Nicolaus Bruhns (1665 – 1697) was a Danish-German organist, violinist and composer and he is regarded as one of the prominent organists and composers of his generation. It will be seen from the dates quoted above how he fits into a chronological sequence - Tunder, Bruhns and Bach which matches the evolution of the Baroque style. In their series of concerts *Musica Poetica* have been taking us on a voyage of discovery through the musical revolution of the German Baroque by performing Tunder's complete vocal works alongside music by his contemporaries. Their series will continue with concerts in September, October and November and, of course, these will be listed in City Events. It should be noted that Musica Poetica's concerts are free. Their venue is most appropriate in that St Sepulchre without Newgate is the Musicians' Church.

Works being played at two Organ Recitals have caught the eye of the reviewer. At **St Michael Cornhill** on Monday 5 June at 1.00pm Gordon Stewart will be giving a recital of music originally scored for instruments other than the organ, featuring works by Handel, Bach, Ernst, Saint-Saëns and Wagner, ending with the latter's '*Ride of the Valkyries*'. That particular musical journey promises to be exciting. Again at **St Michael Cornhill**, this time on Monday 19 June at 1.00pm, Christopher Herrick will be presenting a programme entitled 'Organ Fireworks' which will include the mighty 'Sonata on the 94th Psalm' by Julius Reubke, considered one of the pinnacles of the Romantic repertoire. It should be added that the work requires very advanced pedal technique. The recital should prove to be a *tour de force* indeed.

The following pages contain much that is of arguably equal interest. The intention of the above review is to indicate the diversity of events in the City churches and thus to whet the appetite of all readers.
