In the 21st century there are obviously many centenaries and one of these is of special interest to the Friends., Queen Victoria was born on the 24th of May, 1819 and the Friends of the City Churches will be marking that historic occasion with a special service of Choral Evensong in **St Mary Abchurch** on **Wednesday 26th June at 3pm**. The service promises to be a memorable occasion with music performed at commemorative services during her long reign of 63 years. The printed Order of Service will contain a number of historic photographs, coupled with an informative article concerning her historic reign. All are cordially invited to attend the service. Summer Music in City Churches is a fledgling festival, founded in 2018, presenting beautiful music to inspire, divert and engage, in ancient and architecturally stunning churches in London's Square Mile. The theme for the second festival in June 2019 is **Words and Music**. Commencing on **Thursday 20th June** there will be a week and a half of events. There will be sumptuous settings of poetry, lyrical music inspired by poetry, plays and literature, words that illuminate music with biographical insight and context, music of significance to literary heroes and heroines, and more: altogether it promises to be a lyrical celebration. A 'box' display can be found on the back page listing the dates and titles of the fifteen events. A number of the events in the festival are listed in the 'Events and Concerts' pages below. Then there is the **Knollys Rose Ceremony**. This ancient ceremony is held annually in June when the Master of the Watermen and Lightermen of the River Thames cuts a rose from a bush in the garden in Seething Lane and takes it to the Lord Mayor in Mansion House as a symbol of the fine imposed on Lady Constance Knollys in 1381 for erecting a footbridge between two of her properties in Seething Lane without permission. The ceremony will be held on **Monday 17th June** commencing at **All Hallows by the Tower** at 10.45am.

As part of the London Festival of Architecture **St Lawrence Jewry** on **Monday 10th June** is hosting an evening event — *Re-Imagining the Bounds* — looking at the renewal and refurbishment of the church fabric. Of particular interest will be the new main entrance doors to the church. The event will be followed by an optional walk tracing the boundaries of St Lawrence Jewry. Full details are given at the entry in the listings below.

As always, musical events are numerous in June and, in addition to the *Summer Music in City Churches* described above, several of these 'catch the eye'. At **St Botolph Aldgate** on **Wednesday 26th June** the renowned American organist Gwendolyn Toth makes a welcome return. She will be presenting another of her intriguing recitals of early organ music with the title 'Songs and Dances for Organ'. This will include works from the fifteenth century *Buxheimer Orgelbuch* together with some sixteenth century compositions from France, the Netherlands and Spain. A particular point of musicological interest is that the tabular inscription of the Buxheim Organ Book consists of a seven-line system and letters, the so-called "older" German [organ tablature](#). This recital promises to be a musical treat. Then at **St Michael Cornhill** on **Monday 3rd June** Christopher Herrick will give a recital in which one of the items will be Liszt's Fantasia and Fugue on the chorale, *Ad nos, ad salutarum undam*. This piece has been described as one of the greatest works written for organ, and the pinnacle of the nineteenth century organ repertoire. In the same recital, in marked contrast, Iain Farrington's variations on the hymn tune 'Amazing Grace' will be performed. Again, this recital has the hallmarks of a veritable musical treat
