A talk, modern organ music, animal inspiration and new pastures

At **St Botolph Aldersgate** an interesting series of talks continues in September. The talks are organised by the London City Presbyterian Church with the aim of taking a deeper look at aspects of Reformed theology and practice as it relates to modern questions and issues. The goal is to achieve a better understanding of one's faith by taking a lead from the Scripture as it is summarised in the Reformed confessions. The focus of the September lecture will be on strategies for reading and interpreting the riches of Scripture, particularly through consideration of patterns of thought and approaches to interpretation from the church of ages past, and thus to help one more clearly understand the doctrine of the Trinity. The lecture entitled "Reading the Trinity: The Triune God in Narrative Discourse" is to be given by the Revd Dr Harrison Perkins on **Saturday 21st September** commencing at 7.00pm. Tea, coffee and other refreshments will be served after the lecture.

Compositions for the organ inspired by the Orgelbüchlein Project will be performed at **St Lawrence Jewry** on two occasions. On **Tuesday 10th September** Catherine Ennis will perform two pieces based on the familiar hymn tune – the "Old Hundredth". In a varied programme, including J S Bach and Parry she will play Henry Purcell's *Voluntary on the Old Hundredth* and following that, in very marked contrast, Iain Farrington's Prelude "*Herr Gott, dich loben alle wir*", also inspired by the hymn tune. They should provide interesting listening. Then later at **St Lawrence Jewry**, on **Tuesday 24th September** Jeremiah Stephenson will perform two pieces from the Project – Frederick Stocken's "*Gieb Fried, O frommer, treuer Gott*" and "*O heiliger Geist, du göttliches Feuer*" by Phillip Moore. Looking at the full programme, an earlier piece in that recital has caught the eye, 'The Reverend Mustard his installation prelude' by Nico Muhly, the American contemporary classical music composer and arranger. With other pieces by Stanford, Mendelssohn and John Stanley the recital promises to be most entertaining.

In recitals and concerts compositions by the performers themselves occur quite often and this is happening on **Friday 20th September** at **St Bride Fleet Street**. In the recital, clarinettist Nadia Wilson will be joined by the musician and composer Martin Butler who will accompany her on the piano. In a varied programme one of the works to be performed has 'caught the eye'. This is *Barlow Dale: Four Characteristic Pieces*, composed by Martin Butler for clarinet and piano accompaniment. Not for the first time an animal has been the inspiration for artistic composition. Martin Butler's aunt, Ruth Siverns, young fiancée of Philip Larkin and inspiration of some of his early poetry, wrote a book for children entitled '*Barlow Dale's Casebook*', featuring a Blue Persian cat detective. The name was a parody amalgam of Sherlock Holmes, James Bond, Poirot and Dr Finlay's Casebook. Each of the four pieces is the name of a character who features in the book. The names are given in the listing. The pieces themselves are very interesting to listen to. The other works in the recital are by Joseph Horowitz, Claude Debussy and André Messager. The programme promises to showcase the technical excellence of the two performers and the attention they will pay to the various musical styles featured in the programme.

Finally we remind readers and listeners that MATH – Music at Hill – continues to flourish, not at St Mary at Hill any more but in its new venue of St Giles in the Fields, near Centre Point at the junction of Charing Cross Road, Tottenham Court Road and Oxford Street.
