In the section at the bottom of this page reference is made regarding how necessary it is for anyone wishing to attend any function in a City church to check what that church requires concerning safeguarding against the Corona virus. Basically Covid 19 has not gone away. Vaccination provides a measure of immunity but it is not total immunity. Although safeguarding measures in churches are no longer mandatory it is interesting to note that a significant number of City churches do have specific requirements, particularly regarding social distancing and the use of face covering. These tend to vary with each church and we cannot emphasise too strongly that potential attendees at a function in a City church really should ascertain those requirements by visiting the website of the church prior to actually attending the event.

As the Christmas period approaches City churches are already holding services and musical events related to the season and most certainly have a number of events lined up. Because of that your editorial team have decided that the next edition of our Online City Events should cover a longer period than the customary two weeks. We plan to produce an edition covering the period Monday 6th December 2021 to Sunday 2nd January 2022. Suffice to say the seasonal schedules of the churches have begun to roll in. We can safely predict that this special edition will be a bumper one.

We refer above to the potential of the next edition. We can state here that this one is packed with interesting information. As usual the first section deals with the individual churches. This requires a two-weekly painstaking examination of the websites of the 53 churches listed. Then follows the section dealing with events other than services. For this we welcome the universal help given by the churches in informing us of such events (sometimes after a reminder). That said, we do find it necessary to make use of the examination of the websites for such events, just to make sure that they do not slip through the net and to check up on points of detail, particularly the content of the programmes of concerts and recitals. In doing this, certain of the events 'catch the eye', as we have referred to it many times. The latest batch of events is certainly no exception as you will see.

At **St Lawrence Jewry** on Monday 22nd November Antonio Oyarzabal will be giving a piano recital devoted to the works of women composers. Regular readers of City Events may remember that we have written some articles on women composers. Your editor has to confess that the names appearing in the recital cited at the start are completely unfamiliar, except for that of Lili Boulanger. Clearly there is scope here for another article on the specialised subject quoted. The recital itself has great promise. Turning to another themed recital, at **St Botolph Aldgate** on Wednesday 24th November David Cook will be giving an organ recital with the title 'The Art of the English Voluntary'. The composers listed are familiar except for one, that of William Walond. Your editor has to add to his earlier confession that this name is unfamiliar to him. Doubtless it will be familiar to organists and organ buffs. Turning to the internet there is a fascinating article on William Walond in a back issue of the publication 'The Diapason'. One reads there: 'Next to Stanley's Trumpet Voluntary, William Walond's *Cornet Voluntary in G major* (Op. 1, No. 5) is probably the best-known piece of English organ music to have survived from the eighteenth century. Surprisingly little is known, however, about the composer.' Sadly there is insufficient space here for more detail. Interested readers are urged to track down the article on the internet. Suffice to say it is new subject occurrences like this that make the job of editing City Events so interesting – particularly when one learns that William Walond has been described as an *organorum pulsator* (an "organ beater").
