

## NEW YEAR, NEW RESOLUTIONS

The ringing tills of Christmas are long silent. Food and drink are now taken in moderation. Diets commenced. Belts tightened. January sales are spent. VAT has increased. The "crunch" has come. How will we all cope?

As we have done in the past. "Hang on in" as the colloquial saying goes. Black Death, Great Fire, South Sea Bubble, Blitz, Lloyds collapse, bank bailouts. All part of the eich pattern of life; all unwanted and all to be overcome. The human instinct for survival triumphs. But what about those who cannot adapt, who have too little to ease their belt-tightening and cutting back? The City churches are full of reminders of the care of Man for his fellow Man - bread shelves for the hungry, benefaction boards, inscribed memorials to the great and good recording donation of their estates to fund almshouses, schools, scholarships, coals and food for the poor and needy. Even the fabric of the buildings themselves have been shared in the past with those less fortunate, as at **St Botolph Aldgate** for the homeless or **St Katharine Cree** for meals for liverymen after the Great Fire. Driven by a Christian conscience to care for others and also perhaps to ensure a place in heaven, the City churches have plenty to remind us of their former parishioners "doing their bit". And so it will continue; looking after both body and soul in some unexpected ways. Remember the Salvation Army, whose headquarters are on Queen Victoria Street, an organisation founded in 1865 by William and Catherine Booth to care for the unloved and underprivileged; and two streets north, **St Martin Ludgate** is being adapted so staff can offer confidential counselling to those with mental burdens in these troubled times - the Gateway Project, see <http://www.stmartin-within-ludgate.org.uk/home/gateway.php>. Here is a church that is using its building in a practical new way. And as we walk up Ludgate Hill we will soon notice that St Martin's South front will have two newly re-opened doorcases as Wren had intended, providing step-free access for those with poor mobility. It will still provide regular services and spiritual refreshment as do all the other City churches. You can't miss them, but when did you last step inside one?

Use them or lose them? Not if the Friends of the City Churches can help it. We make sure 15 of them are open at least once a week by Watching in them.

Why not join the Friends and play your part too? Maybe not by Watching,, but by helping n some other way, by providing money or by joining in the churches' worship and other activities, listed in these pages. In the words of a Japanese poem by Hô-ô called The Master Stroke:

A seedling shoulders up some crumbs of ground  
The fields are suddenly green for miles around!

## **The Big Society**

It would be hard to explain 'The Big Society' to our City ancestors, both as a buzzword and as a concept. Indeed, the phrase would seem contradictory to the generations for whom Society was a largely leisured class whose interest in the lower orders could be satisfied with the odd charity bazaar or donation. Whole doctoral theses could be written on the question of how other ages perceived themselves as social units, an issue on which there is still little agreement: it wasn't so long ago that a previous Conservative prime minister declared that "there is no such thing as society". Her meaning wasn't anarchical, of course, for she immediately then said "No government can do anything except through people ... It's our duty to look after ourselves and then also to look after our neighbour."

That is pretty much how the City worked through the many centuries when its streets teemed with people of all social classes, living cheek by jowl, interdependent on one another's labour and resources, good will and co-operation. They might have used the 'S word' differently, but the concept would have been too obvious to require explanation but to the odd Scrooge, begrudging even some slight provision for the Poor and Destitute at Christmas – and even he changed his tune, once his eyes were opened to the wealth of humanity beyond his own meagre existence.

In a world without health insurance, disability allowances, unemployment benefits or even state education, where a pension was a gift to be wrung from a wealthy patron, and debt led to prison, a network of guilds and parishes, clubs and charities, small businesses and generous benefactors provided much that the State now supplies, from poor relief and medical care to the provision of schools and libraries. Many of the City's ancient livery companies were founded as much with a view to the welfare of their members as regulation of their trade, functioning as burial societies to ensure that none went to a pauper's grave, and mutual associations to care for the widows and orphans, the aged and infirm of their brotherhood. Now that most of their regulatory functions have been assumed by others, they still flourish as social and charitable bodies, with no want of applicants for their resources. The City parishes, equally, cared for their own poor from the cradle to the grave – sometimes grudgingly, as the church wardens' records testily record, but more often from a profound belief in the community of neighbours living, working and worshipping together in very close proximity to one another in a crowded city.

The Friends of the City Churches, like so many long-established voluntary groups around the country, would also now appear to be totally on-message, by dint of carrying on as usual, providing modest donations of money and generous donations of time for the greater good. The FCC specifically answers a need within the City of London, to help its many marvellous churches to maintain the fabric of their splendid buildings and remain open to the public, now that their congregations have dwindled and their ancient revenues have been subsumed into common funds. The FCC also gives back to its members, with lectures and visits, guided walks and social events throughout the year. Whatever one might think of 'small government, big society', there is much to be given and gained by joining a group like the FCC, and helping us to help others, while perhaps improving yourself.

## **DELIVERANCE FROM LIVING DEATH: THE MIRACLE OF RESURRECTION**

Last autumn the world held its breath as thirty-three Chilean miners waited, trapped 700 metres underground in the San Jose mine, desperately hoping to be rescued. They waited for 69 days until they were finally brought to the surface through a combination of modern technology and extraordinary determination and perseverance.

The story, as it unfolded in all its nail-biting drama, was watched by an estimated one billion people, and there was a genuine sense of joy and triumph around the world when all the men were finally rescued and reunited with their families.

The miners were a colourful and mixed crowd, certainly no angels, ranging in age from 19 to 63. They were hard-living, colourful characters. They were also for the most part devout Roman Catholics. They prayed every day, and they openly and publicly gave thanks to God when they were released from their underground tomb.

I don't think it is too fanciful to see their story as a modern-day metaphor for the Easter story. The miners descended into Hell - those first 17 days were a living hell, not knowing if help was coming, slowly starving to death until the initial borehole reached them. Then they began to believe in the power of Resurrection - the knowledge that there was the possibility of life beyond almost certain death, as the drillers worked frantically to reach their target without causing further rock falls. Finally came their deliverance, ending in glorious Ascension, as one by one they were brought in the capsule to the surface and the sunlight and the fresh air they had thought they might never breathe again.

The whole experience seemed to them, and to the watching millions, nothing less than a miracle. Who knows, perhaps the Vatican will declare it to be one in years to come. Be that as it may, the rescue of those 33 miners was a truly wonderful and inspiring moment, and a reminder that the power of Resurrection is a present reality as well as an historic event. God speaks to us at the level of our deepest experience, at the time of our deepest need. And whether we are Chilean miners, or redundant City workers or desperate housewives, or just ordinary struggling people, the miracle of resurrection can be found within the ordinary routine of our daily lives. For each of us it will be different, and we can't predict how it will happen. But the assurance that our weakness and suffering can be confronted and answered is the faith to which the miracle of the first Easter morning is the supreme and enduring witness.

## **DEDICATIONS**

Unlike secular Bank holidays limited just to a celebration of the pagan May Day [2<sup>nd</sup> this year] and a transferred and demoted Whit Monday “Spring” [30<sup>th</sup>], the Anglican Calendar of Holy Days for the month of May celebrates no less than three apostles as well as 3 archbishops, 2 bishops, an abbot, a monk, 3 reformers [1 religious and 1 social], a spiritual writer, a spiritual guide, 3 evangelists and 1 visionary, all the English Saints and Martyrs of the Reformation era and the Visit of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Elizabeth.

Now the City, important as it is, cannot lay claim to all those as residents, liverymen, visitors or clerics but we can flesh out some of them. Even The Blessed Virgin Mary [31<sup>st</sup>] is alleged to have appeared to one of the canons at the pre-reformation **St Bartholomew the Great**.

James the Apostle[1<sup>st</sup>] is the dedication of the church **St James Garlickhythe** on Garlick Hill, re-built by Wren and noted for its fine woodwork, and escaping not just a second world war bomb but also a 1990s crane. Another church dedicated to James was in **Duke’s Place** demolished in 1874.

Many died for their faith during the reformation, notable among them John Rogers, lecturer at St Paul’s Cathedral who was burned in Smithfield. A memorial on the curtain wall of Bart’s Hospital marks the spot. Nearby in Suttons’ Hospital Charterhouse, just outside the City, is a modern day memorial to the Carthusian monks there who were martyred at Tyburn. Both Protestants and Catholics now share a joint commemoration on 4<sup>th</sup> May. Dunstan, Archbishop of Canterbury [19<sup>th</sup>] is remembered in **St Dunstan in the East** – now just a Wren steeple and beautiful garden - and **St Dunstan in the West**, a Guild church by John Shaw 1830-33 with strong interiors celebrating the church’s association with the Eastern Orthodox faith. Dunstan is patron saint of goldsmiths, and at one time, this day was the changeover to a new year mark. John and Charles Wesley, evangelists and hymn writers, are remembered on 24 May, the day in 1738 that John had his religious experience at a Moravian meeting house in Aldersgate Street. He had been a pupil at Charterhouse, unlike Charles, more renowned for his hymn-writing, who was educated at Westminster School and confined himself to that city.

On 26<sup>th</sup> we celebrate Augustine, the first Archbishop of Canterbury, remembered in the dedication of **St Augustine Watling Street**, previously known as **by St Paul’s Gate** and also **Old Change**. Rebuilt by Wren, it suffered bomb damage in the last war and its tower has now been converted for use as part of the Cathedral Choir School.

Immediately opposite this is the new shopping destination of the City, *One New Change*- it’s architecture by Jean Nouvel reflecting the historic surroundings. Do ascend the lift to the 6<sup>th</sup> floor and look from the roof terrace to see a panorama of spires and towers, and then, suitably inspired, take to the streets and visit the churches themselves.

## THE CITY CHURCH VISITOR

Why do people visit the City churches? For most of their history, of course, the buildings were straightforward parish churches providing for their parishioners who lived locally the full range of Sunday services, christenings, weddings and funerals, and the other elements of parish life that varied from Saints' festivals in the Middle Ages to char-a-banc outings in the last century. It may not have been quite as cosy as sentiment suggests (not least to judge from the human drama of contemporary diaries and churchwardens' accounts), but the church was for centuries the focus of a community life that only a few City parishes now maintain, even in attenuated form.

Particularly, why would anyone now visit a City church? That's a weighted question, as the Friends of the City Churches demonstrated internally when the head of our new marketing group asked members of the Executive Committee – all enthusiasts, but of many stripes – what they would recommend to first-time visitors. Their responses ranged from the spiritual to the architectural: at least once, take the time to contemplate or pray, but don't miss the Grinling Gibbons reredos in St. Mary Abchurch. Take in a lunchtime concert, and let the music guide your eyes to the wonders of Wren and his office, or the medieval artisans whose work has miraculously survived so many trials. Log on to the Internet Church any time of the day or night ([www.londoninternetchurch.org.uk](http://www.londoninternetchurch.org.uk)), but also look out for annual events such as the Lion Sermon at St. Katharine Cree or the beating of the bounds around various parishes.

For all their touristic appeal, it might surprise some folks to observe how many people drop into the City churches during the working day to pray, sit quietly with their own thoughts, or even light a candle. Many people worship in the City, with a choice of denominations and persuasions attested by the list of weekday services on the next page, and weekend services on the City Events Web site ([www.cityevents.org.uk](http://www.cityevents.org.uk)). Smells and bells, happy clappy, modified rapture – there's a City church for every shade of devotion within the proverbial Square Mile, not to mention a wealth of gorgeous backdrops for a wedding, and historic fonts for a christening.

Would that all those happy events led directly and inevitably to increased congregations. Some churches are full on Sunday, while others serve their regular communicants on a weekday, enjoying bursts of activity with greatly increased congregations for special services, with a spike at Christmas when they host corporate and livery carol services. As well as the spiritual diversity, there are social rewards for those who join a service, even as visitors, not least the chance of light refreshments and a bit of a chat afterward.

It is thanks in part to the work of the Friends of the City Churches over the last two decades that so many churches are now open regularly during the week even if no particular service is being held. In sixteen of them FCC volunteer Church Watchers welcome visitors on a regular basis ([www.london-city-churches.org.uk](http://www.london-city-churches.org.uk)). It is partly on account of that success that attendance on our annual City Churches Walks has been gradually declining. This year the Guided Walks will be held within a broader City framework. During the City of London Festival they will set out from St. Magnus the Martyr, Lower Thames Street, on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July and Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> July at 14:00; to book, please visit our Web site or contact the FCC (details below). Ticket price is £8 in advance or £9 on the day. In September we shall be operating within the Open House weekend (17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup>), when most of the churches in the City will be open. Whatever your motivation in visiting a City church, you are always more than welcome.

## SUMMER IS A-COMING IN

Summer is officially here - a drought has been declared in East Anglia and the rest of the country is sheltering under umbrellas as "showery periods" do their worst. Just in time for the school holidays and when we welcome many visitors from overseas. Sunshine or showers, it is a great time of the year to walk round our City and drop in to some of our marvellous churches.

Where do the Friends of the City churches fit in to this? In two practical ways. We encourage the City churches to participate in the imaginative Diocesan gutter scheme so that showery intervals don't overflow blocked gutters and downpipes as all will have been cleared regularly by a specialist contractor; and we keep no less than sixteen of the churches open in between services with our Watchers, who are all unpaid volunteers. In fact, we are only watching in fifteen of them at the moment as **St Martin Ludgate** is closed for works relating to their new Gateway Centre, although the Thursday service continues at 1.15pm each week. We have recently added the **Dutch Church** to our list of Watched churches. This post war church in Austin Friars by Arthur Bailey, 1950-54, replaced a building heavily restored in 1863 after damage by fire. This in turn suffered a direct hit in WW2 and the Bailey church is now the building we see today. Austin Friars runs from Old Broad Street to Throgmorton Avenue. It takes a bit of finding but the church is well worth a visit. There is excellent carving on the Portland stone edifice by Esmond Burton, and John Skeaping was responsible for the weathervane - unusually for the City, in the form of a large cockerel. Inside, there is good stained glass and a large tapestry. The name Austin Friars relates to the church served by Augustinian Friars founded in 1253 by Henry III's Constable Humphrey de Bohun. At the Reformation only its long preaching nave was kept and this was given in 1550 to the Dutch Protestants; a so-called "Stranger Church". We keep the church open on the second Tuesday of each month, so 12<sup>th</sup> July and 9<sup>th</sup> August, from 11am to 3pm. Other watched churches on Tuesdays are **St Dunstan in the West** and two of the City's three **St Botolph's**, at **Aldersgate** [1-4pm only] and **Aldgate** [11-3pm]. The third **St Botolph** at **Bishopsgate** is open to the public every weekday from 8 am to 5.30 pm. The City is traditionally known as "The Square Mile" but it may feel more than that if you visit all five churches on one Tuesday!

A full list of our watched churches is on our website and our Watchers have cards to give out with the times in a convenient format too. Each City church (not only the ones at which we watch) is the subject of an information page on our website, [www.london-city-churches.org.uk](http://www.london-city-churches.org.uk), just click the button "Index of Churches" and then click on the church you want to know more about.

There is another opportunity to view the City churches on **Wednesday 6th July** when guided walks will start at 2pm from **St Magnus the Martyr** and again on **Tuesday 12th July** starting at 2pm from **St Stephen Walbrook**. Do join in with these if you can (you can just turn up); the cost is just £8. They are led by experts and really allow you to understand the history and architecture of these wonderful gems. You might even wish to join over 1,000 other enthusiasts as a Friend and perhaps even as a church Watcher. Welcome!

## **THE KING JAMES BIBLE**

The 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 'the Book that changed the world' has been an understated affair, as befits the dignity of the work. Nonetheless, no one whose taste inclines to the BBC 2 / Radio 4 end of the cultural spectrum could be unaware that the Authorized Version of the Holy Bible, translated into English at the behest of James VI and I, was first published in 1611 and is being celebrated internationally throughout this quadricentenary year. Melvyn Bragg did a piece for BBC 2, and James Naughtie did a series for Radio 4 (the latter still available on BBC iPlayer). The book itself is touring 17 City churches over 100 days, finishing with a service at St. Paul's Cathedral on October 5 ([www.kingjamesbibletrust.org](http://www.kingjamesbibletrust.org)); poignantly, it will visit St. Magnus the Martyr, where Miles Coverdale, author and editor of the very first complete English translation, the Great Bible of 1540, now lies.

In contrast to the technology that made those first editions possible, the KJV is now available as searchable text or a free download online, as a Kindle eBook, and on a choice of DVDs (including a 19-hour narration by Johnny Cash, which he counted amongst his finest work). There are several Facebook pages devoted to it, and a slew of apps for iPod, iPad, iPhone and Android devices. If that's Greek to you, the OUP has also issued a commemorative facsimile, mercifully substituting Roman type for the original blackletter, but reproducing the first edition down to the misprints; with a cover price of £50, even without markdowns on Amazon it is much cheaper than the original, which sold for ten shillings looseleaf, twelve shillings bound, at a time when an artisan might earn a shilling a day.

Of course, both the price and design of the first Authorized Version reflect that it was intended for public use in churches rather than private devotions (those editions came later). Yet it would surprise if not outrage the divines of 1611 to find the Bible now celebrated in the theatre, much less a National Theatre with women amongst those giving twelve readings, from Creation to Revelation, later this autumn. Fittingly, to our minds, Shakespeare's Globe hosted a marathon reading between Palm Sunday and Easter Monday (69 hours altogether), while the Bush Theatre produced a unique promenade in Westminster Abbey last spring, and will present the epic *Sixty-Six Books* in October. This is "a contemporary response to some of the oldest stories ever told" from 66 writers – from Billy Bragg to the Archbishop of Canterbury – that will include two weekend marathons and a twelve-version overnight session in the Abbey.

Somewhat more modestly, in September, the Friends of the City Churches will host 'A Celebration of Lancelot Andrewes and the King James Bible' at St. Giles Cripplegate, where the distinguished scholar served as vicar for 17 years before becoming Bishop of Chichester in 1605. In the great committee that undertook the king's commission, Bishop Andrewes led the group that translated the first 14 books (Genesis to Chronicles), and oversaw the whole work to completion. Managing 47 scholars in six teams and three cities over seven years must surely rank as one of the greatest academic achievements of all time; that they produced a masterpiece is all the more remarkable. Read it!

## Wir pflügen und wir streuen

It's autumn and the City settles down to its regular pattern of work. In the countryside, however, hard-pressed clergy fly round their multi-parish benefices taking Harvest Festival services. And the most popular hymn of all will be *We Plough the Fields and Scatter*. This was originally in German, by poet Matthias Claudius, published 1782, and set to music in 1800, attributed to J. A. P. Schulz. Shades of another traditional festival memento: Christmas trees coming from Germany with Prince Albert.

Harvest is from the Anglo-Saxon word *haverfest*, meaning "Autumn". It then came to refer to the season for reaping and gathering grain and other grown products. The full moon nearest the autumnal equinox is called the Harvest Moon. This year it was 12 September but it may be in October some years.

Canada and the United States each have their own Thanksgiving celebrations in October and November. Certain religious holidays, such as the Jewish Sukkot have their roots in harvest festivals.

The modern British tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival in churches began in 1843, when the Revd Robert Hawker invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service at his church at Morwenstow in Cornwall. The dates of harvest festivals nowadays are tied more to clerical and congregational convenience than strict lunar observance. In terms of giving thanks for God's gifts to his people, the City churches also play their part. **St Mary at Hill** has its Harvest of the Sea Service on Sunday 9th October at 11am. Instead of the more usual fruit and vegetable harvest, here is the Fish Harvest, a traditional Billingsgate celebration.

Meanwhile at **St Benet Paul's Wharf**, on Sunday 2nd October at 3pm, there will be a Harvest Festival combined with the Induction of the new Priest in charge, The Revd Dr Aneurin Glyn. As with most celebratory services at St Benet, this will be partly in Welsh and partly in English reflecting the Welsh roots of the present congregation of that church. Originally founded in 1111, the 900<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church was celebrated last month when a prominent Welsh theologian, no less than the Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr Rowan Williams, celebrated the Eucharist. The Welsh have worshipped here since An Order in Council signed by Queen Victoria in 1879 removed St Benet from the list of churches to be demolished and granted the use of the church to the Welsh Anglicans for the conduct of services "according to the Rites of the Church of England".

A Business Harvest Festival is held at **St Stephen Walbrook** for the business community (this year on 28th September) with presentation of annual accounts rather than the more traditional agricultural produce. And in a more secular vein, on 21st October, the Fruiterers' Company makes its annual formal presentation of fruit to the Lord Mayor at the Mansion House.

Our Watchers are at St Benet Paul's Wharf and St Mary at Hill on Thursdays to allow the churches to be open.

## Wir pflügen und wir streuen

It's autumn and the City settles down to its regular pattern of work. In the countryside, however, hard-pressed clergy fly round their multi-parish benefices taking Harvest Festival services. And the most popular hymn of all will be *We Plough the Fields and Scatter*. This was originally in German, by poet Matthias Claudius, published 1782, and set to music in 1800, attributed to J. A. P. Schulz. Shades of another traditional festival memento: Christmas trees coming from Germany with Prince Albert.

Harvest is from the Anglo-Saxon word *haverfest*, meaning "Autumn". It then came to refer to the season for reaping and gathering grain and other grown products. The full moon nearest the autumnal equinox is called the Harvest Moon. This year it was 12 September but it may be in October some years.

Canada and the United States each have their own Thanksgiving celebrations in October and November. Certain religious holidays, such as the Jewish Sukkot have their roots in harvest festivals.

The modern British tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival in churches began in 1843, when the Revd Robert Hawker invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service at his church at Morwenstow in Cornwall. The dates of harvest festivals nowadays are tied more to clerical and congregational convenience than strict lunar observance. In terms of giving thanks for God's gifts to his people, the City churches also play their part. **St Mary at Hill** has its Harvest of the Sea Service on Sunday 9th October at 11am. Instead of the more usual fruit and vegetable harvest, here is the Fish Harvest, a traditional Billingsgate celebration.

Meanwhile at **St Benet Paul's Wharf**, on Sunday 2nd October at 3pm, there will be a Harvest Festival combined with the Induction of the new Priest in charge, The Revd Dr Aneurin Glyn. As with most celebratory services at St Benet, this will be partly in Welsh and partly in English reflecting the Welsh roots of the present congregation of that church. Originally founded in 1111, the 900<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church was celebrated last month when a prominent Welsh theologian, no less than the Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr Rowan Williams, celebrated the Eucharist. The Welsh have worshipped here since An Order in Council signed by Queen Victoria in 1879 removed St Benet from the list of churches to be demolished and granted the use of the church to the Welsh Anglicans for the conduct of services "according to the Rites of the Church of England".

A Business Harvest Festival is held at **St Stephen Walbrook** for the business community (this year on 28th September) with presentation of annual accounts rather than the more traditional agricultural produce. And in a more secular vein, on 21st October, the Fruiterers' Company makes its annual formal presentation of fruit to the Lord Mayor at the Mansion House.

Our Watchers are at St Benet Paul's Wharf and St Mary at Hill on Thursdays to allow the churches to be open.

## **THE CHURCHES AND THE LIVERY**

The City of London is remarkable not only for its ancient churches, but also for its ancient livery companies. Each had its proper sphere, in the care of souls and the regulation of trade respectively, but both exerted political and social influence, and each provided much by way of education and charity. Although the number of livery companies continues to grow, and the number of churches has fallen over the years, the two remain united by a network formed in the Middle Ages. Many of the older companies began as fraternities of like-minded men and women with at least as much interest in spiritual development as their trade. As they began to focus on specific crafts, trades and sectors, guilds emerged, with ordinances to control quality, prices, wages and working conditions, and resources to care for their own – educating the young, housing the old, and providing for widows and orphans. A good funeral was one final reward of membership, and companies including the Fishmongers, Merchant Taylors, Brewers, Pewterers, Girdlers and Saddlers still have the richly embroidered palls that covered their coffins. With the grant of Royal Charters and distinctive uniforms, the guilds became livery companies, so grand that by 1515, they had to agree on an order of precedence that is binding to this day.

Before they were wealthy enough to build their own halls, the early guilds often met in churches and monasteries, adopting the patron of the establishment as their own – thus, the Drapers trace their origins to the priory church of St. Mary Bethlehem, Bishopsgate (as does Bethlem Royal Hospital, the original 'Bedlam'), with the Virgin Mary as their patron. The Worshipful Company of Joiners and Ceilers has its roots in the Guild of St. James Garlickhythe, formed in 1375, and its spiritual home in that Wren church of 1683. In fact, St. James Garlickhythe now serves no less than ten livery companies, having subsumed no less than six adjacent parishes over the years. Of these, three were lost to the Great Fire of 1666, and two to Victorian demolition; the last, more happily, was converted to a guild church and its parochial functions transferred to St. James. Thus, this valiant survivor now welcomes (in order of precedence), the Skinners, Vintners, Dyers, Painter-Stainers, Joiners and Ceilers, Horners, Needlemakers, Glass Sellers and Looking Glass Makers, Gold and Silver Wyre Drawers, and Fan Makers – all of which makes for some colourful ceremonies, and any number of Christmas carol services.

Some livery companies are still central to trade and industry – the Goldsmiths now assay platinum and palladium as well as gold and silver, and the Fishmongers inspect the new Billingsgate market even though it now stands in Tower Hamlets. Others have moved with the times to expand their brief, so while the Fan Makers' traditional craft now takes them into the world of textile museums and antique collectors, the modern side of the trade leads to air conditioning, aviation and aerospace. At the same time, many companies have long since ceded their powers to regulatory agencies and trade associations, and are now chiefly concerned with education, charity and, of course, conviviality – which is essentially where they began.

As the companies grew, they returned the churches' early hospitality with great generosity. Their arms and emblems are found as often as those of the saints, in stained glass windows, architectural details, monuments and inscriptions – indeed, seeking their signs is one interesting way of looking at a church. In the New Year, the Friends of the City Churches will begin to explore these connections in a series of members' events, visiting individual livery halls and the churches with which they are connected, to appreciate a little more how intimately the City's great institutions are intertwined.

## **AN UPSIDE-DOWN CHRISTMAS**

Have you heard about the upside-down Christmas Tree? it is a fad, but some people are actually attaching their Christmas tree upside down with the base on the ceiling and the top hanging down in the middle of the room like an evergreen stalactite. It's novel, it saves space and it leaves more room for presents! There are however serious drawbacks, like how to water it!

The idea of an upside-down Christmas tree provokes a more serious point about Christmas itself, summed up in Mary's song of subversion which we call the Magnificat. It is a revolutionary song about God's upside-down values which Mary sang when she was told that she was going to give birth to the Saviour. A song about the little people being exalted and the mighty cast down, about the hungry poor being filled, and the rich are being sent away empty.

Mary sang about a new order of things. Her child was not to be a comfort, he was to be an intrusion, and that child was not born in marbled splendour, but in a smelly stable. One thing that we in the City cannot avoid this Christmas is the protest camp outside St Paul's Cathedral. Whatever our views about it, the presence of the protesters has made people talk about issues of justice, financial inequality, and the future of capitalism in a way that our politicians have failed to do. The humble poor have challenged the powerful and the mighty, and thankfully the Cathedral Chapter have begun a process of engagement, taking the issues forward, in the Bishop of London's words 'reconnecting the financial and the ethical'.

The ramshackle protest camp right next to the glorious beauty and majesty of St Paul's Cathedral makes an important statement about our upside-down Gospel message – the King born in a stable, God become human, a nobody becoming the mother of our Lord, the last coming first and the first last.

Christmas in the Bible is not like Christmas in a typical shopping centre, a winter wonderland of shopping and glitter and nostalgia. Christmas in the Bible is much more revolutionary. It connects the glory of St Paul's with the clamour of the camp and tells us that there is a deeper joy and a fuller life than most of us settle for most of the time. Thank God for the way the protest camp challenges us this Christmas to think about the mystery of the Incarnation and the upside-down values about which Mary sang in the Magnificat.

May I wish you all a joyful upside-down Christmas.
